## **Anointing of the Sick**

We encourage parish members to celebrate the Anointing of the Sick for healing and strength at the time of serious illness or before surgery. Anointing is offered during our “First Friday” Mass the first Friday of each month at either 7:00 or 11:30 AM, or by appointment.

## **Communion to the Sick**

## **RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)**

A Special process of preparation is offered to adults who are seeking reception of the Sacraments of Baptism (or profession of faith in the Catholic tradition of Baptized in another Christian church), Confirmation and /or Eucharist. Inquirers into the Catholic Faith are invited to begin the process whenever they are so moved. Risen Savior has an ongoing period of inquiry (the time to discuss and ask the questions they have regarding Catholicism). For those who have not been baptized, the end of the inquiry period is formally recognized at the Rite of Acceptance and the person moves into a period of formation and instruction into the Catholic way of life. The transition from this formation experience to the next state, a period of enlightenment, is marked by the Rite of Election. The entire process then

culminates with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. For those who have been baptized in another Christian tradition, the transition from the period of inquiry to formation is formalized in a Rite of Welcoming. After sufficient formation and discernment, the individual then publicly professes faith in the Catholic tradition and receives the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist either at the Easter Vigil or a regular Sunday liturgy. Confirmation is a community's sacramental celebration of an individual's mature and personal affirmation of the gift of faith which seals the work of the Spirit begun in Baptism. The immediate preparation prior to candidacy for confirmation is viewed in terms of formation. Successful participation in the parish's 7th grade Christian Formation program or Catholic high-school religion/theology classes is required prior to entering the 2 year Confirmation Program.
